
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.





# HAITI

Haiti, located on the western part of the island of Hispaniola in the Caribbean, is a country with a rich and complex history. It was the first independent nation in the Caribbean and the second republic in the Americas, gaining independence from France in 1804 after a successful enslaved persons revolt. This historic event made Haiti the first country to be founded by formerly enslaved people. Over the centuries, however, economic, political, and social difficulties as well as a number of natural disasters have beset Haiti with chronic poverty and other serious problems.

Geographically, Haiti is known for its mountainous terrain, which has influenced its name—derived from the indigenous Taíno word "Ayiti," meaning "land of high mountains". The country shares the island with the Dominican Republic to the east and is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean to the north and the Caribbean Sea to the south.

Haiti has a warm, humid tropical climate. Average temperatures range from the high 70s in January/February to the mid-80s in July/August. The village of Kenscoff, at some 4,700 feet, has an average temperature of about 60°F, whereas Port-au-Prince, at sea level, has an average of 79°F. In winter, frost can occur at high elevations.

Despite its natural beauty and historical significance, Haiti faces numerous challenges. It is one of the poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere,

grappling with political instability, economic difficulties, and natural disasters such as earthquakes and hurricanes. These issues have significantly impacted its development and the well-being of its people.

Culturally, Haiti is vibrant and diverse, with a rich heritage that blends African, French, and indigenous influences. The country is known for its art, music, and religious practices (no official religion; constitution allows for religious freedom, but more than half of the population practices Roman Catholicism), including Voodoo, which plays a significant role in Haitian society. The resilience and creativity of the Haitian people are evident in their cultural expressions and community life.
