

³² "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. ³³ If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. ³⁴ If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. ³⁵ But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. ³⁶ Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.



ASH WEDNESDAY—Wednesday, March 5, 2025

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name..." We'll look at the Introduction and first petition of Luther's explanation.

MIDWEEK LENT 1—Wednesday, March 12, 2025

"...your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven." We'll look at the second and third petitions of Luther's explanation.

MIDWEEK LENT 2—Wednesday, March 19, 2025

"Give us today our daily bread..." We'll look at the 4th petition of Luther's explanation.

MIDWEEK LENT 3—Wednesday, March 26, 2025

"Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us." We'll look at the 5th petition of Luther's explanation.

MIDWEEK LENT 4—Wednesday, April 2, 2025

"Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil." We'll look at the 6^{th} and 7^{th} petitions of Luther's explanation.

MIDWEEK LENT 5—Wednesday, April 9, 2025

"For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen. We'll look at Luther's explanation to what he calls the "conclusion" of the prayer.
